Rising Czech Opera Star Ester Pavlu in Concert at NCSML December 10

NCSML is pleased to present a free public concert by mezzo-soprano Ester Pavlu on December 10. Pavlu is the laureate of several international singing competitions, and received the Beno Blachut Award from the Gstaad International Music Festival in Switzerland. A graduate of the Academy of Performing Arts (Prague), she is a current corps member at the National Theatre in Prague, where she is scheduled to cover the title role in Bizet's Carmen in March 2022. This concert will include operatic works by Dvorak, Martinu, and Janacek, plus holiday fare. NCSML is one of only four US locations where Ms. Pavlu will perform in December; please watch for future updates via social media and at NCSML.org. 

Treasures of Slovakia brings rare and significant artifacts from the Slovak National Museum in Bratislava to NCSML, many leaving Slovakia for the ▶ first time. These items represent the rich history and culture of Slovakia as far back as 1,000 years to current times. Exhibit closes March 20.

Jan Amos Comenius is the Father of Modern Education. Born in 1592 in Nivnice, Moravia, he developed a philosophy call pan sophism which emphasized political unity, religious reconciliation, and cooperation in education. This exhibit is on loan from the National Pedagogical Museum & Library of J.A. Comenius (Czech Republic). Exhibit closes December 31.

Crowning Glory: A Feast of Slovak & Moravian Headdresses will feature nearly 100 items from the Baine/Cincebeaux Collection of Slovak & Czech Folk Dress and Folk Art. Hours of labor and generations of meaning, mystique, and creativity are infused into each unique piece of art. Exhibit closes February 27.

Monsters of the Midway: George Halas and the

Chicago Bears will spotlight Halas' life and work, including his significant role in the formation of the National Football League, and his time as both a player and coach with the Bears. Halas was a first generation Czech American, his parents immigrated from Bohemia. This exhibit will include items on loan from the NFL Hall of Fame and the Chicago History Museum. Exhibit opens March 19.

Vincent Hložník: Between War and Dream features 20 Surrealist-inspired linocut prints by this Slovak artist. From the series Dreams (Sny, 1962), this work is on loan from Derfner Judaica Museum and The Art Collection at Hebrew Home at Riverdale. They represent a turning point in Hložník's work where his figurative motifs take on more symbolic and metaphorical meanings. Exhibit closes January 31.

Amazing Athletes is an exhibit of posters and photographs of famous Czech and Slovak athletes. Exhibit opens February 10.

Faces of Freedom, NCSML's 7,000 square foot, state of the art exhibit, will show you why the Czech and Slovak immigrant story is everyone's story. Discover how it felt to sit in a living room during WWII, or to lie on the bunk of a steam ship on your way to America. Stand in Wenceslaus Square amidst shaking keys at the height of the Velvet Revolution, view a Tatra secret police car, an authentic JAWA motorcycle, and a replicated communist watch tower. See rare artifacts, experience cutting-edge interactive displays, and celebrate your own culture with exhibits on puppets, music, and art.

Dance Workshop Addresses Issues of Democracy

On Saturday, December 18 from 2-6 pm, dancer, educator and choreographer Dagmar Spain will lead a workshop at NCSML on movement as a physical dialogue for expressing democracy. This workshop is appropriate for anyone interested in communication: no prior dance training or experience is necessary.

Spain considers and refers to movement as dialogue, quoting theologian Kai Alhanen as her inspiration for this approach: The kind of learning that occurs in dialogue is a constantly developing understanding of the world's phenomena, other people, and oneself. Through her workshop, she strives to deepen participants' understanding of their contribution to democracy and empowered citizenship.

A native of the Czech Republic, Spain holds an MFA in dance and choreography from Tisch School of the Arts, NYU, and is currently pursuing doctoral studies in dance education at Columbia University (NY). This innovative, experiential workshop will be offered free of charge, but registration is required by calling 319-362-8500.


